

COLLEGE CELEBRATES 77TH REPUBLIC DAY

Prof. K.C. Reddy, President of Dr Lankapalli Bullayya Colleges, unfurled the National Flag and received an impressive guard of honour. The ceremonial march past featured six contingents of NCC cadets and one contingent of Rangers and Rovers of Bharat Scouts and Guides.

On the occasion, NCC and NSS students were presented special awards by Prof. K.C. Reddy and Dr. G. Madhu Kumar, Secretary and Correspondent of the college, in recognition of their outstanding service and commitment. The highlight of the programme was the felicitation of Major T. Bhramananda Reddy for his distinguished and sustained service to the NCC spanning over two decades.

Addressing the gathering, the Chief Guest emphasised the sacrifices made by freedom fighters and the vision behind the framing of the Indian Constitution. He urged students to recall, remember and realise the contributions of their elders who fought for India's independence from British rule and to uphold constitutional values.

The celebrations concluded with vibrant cultural programmes presented by students, reflecting the spirit of nationalism. Principals, faculty members, and students of the college participated in large numbers.

DISCUSSION MEET

SIDAR IN ASSOCIATION WITH DR. L.B. COLLEGE HOLDS A DISCUSSION MEET



On January 31, 2026, the Society for Integrated Development and Research (SIDAR), in association with Dr. Lankapalli Bullayya College, organised a discussion meet on “Depreciation of Indian Rupee and its Implications for the Indian Economy” at Block-IV, Golden Jubilee Seminar Hall at 11.00 a.m. Eminent academicians, economists, business leaders, principals, faculty members, students, and prominent citizens of the city participated in the deliberations.

Prof. K. C. Reddy, President, Society for Collegiate Education and President, SIDAR, inaugurated the session. In his address, he explained the multiple factors contributing to the depreciation of the Indian Rupee, including the decline in exports, rise in imports, widening current account deficit, and changes in US tariff policies. He observed that the downward pressure on the rupee may continue unless corrective measures are taken. Prof. Reddy emphasized the need for a stable and strict trade policy, increased capital inflows through FDI, strengthening of manufacturing sectors—especially MSMEs—and proactive internal and external economic policies to revitalise the economy. Dr. G. Madhukumar, Secretary and Correspondent, Dr. Lankapalli Bullayya Colleges, drawing from his extensive experience in foreign currency trading, highlighted that low productivity levels, demand-supply dynamics of foreign exchange, and the role of domestic investors are key reasons behind the rupee's depreciation.

Prof. Harinarayana presented insightful data on exchange rate fluctuations and explained that current account deficit, low exports, low productivity, export elasticity, and income elasticity are major contributors to the weakening of the rupee. He recommended measures such as inter-trade, intra-trade, intra-firm trade, rupee-based trade agreements, export promotion initiatives, and rationalisation of imports. He opined that while the depreciation may have a negative impact in the short run, it could stabilise the economy in the long run.

The discussion was effectively anchored by Prof. V. Balamohandas, who coordinated the session seamlessly. The programme concluded with an interactive question-and-answer session, where participants actively engaged with the speakers, making the discussion insightful and impactful.

TREKKING

ENGINEERING COLLEGE ORGANISES TREK AT KAMBALAKONDA WILDLIFE SANCTUARY



The NSS Units of Dr. Lankapalli Bullayya College of Engineering, in collaboration with the Department of Basic Sciences and Humanities, organised a 3 km trek at Kambalakonda Wildlife Sanctuary on 04 January 2026 from 6.30 a.m. onwards for staff and students, with the objective of promoting physical fitness, environmental conservation, and institutional bonding.

FACULTY FORUM

DEPARTMENT OF LIFE SCIENCES CONDUCTS A FACULTY KNOWLEDGE FORUM



As part of the academic curriculum, the faculty members in the Department of Life Sciences organized a Faculty Knowledge Forum for undergraduates on January 24, 2026, in the Block 5 seminar hall at 2:45 PM. The session began with a welcome note, followed by a presentation by Dr. B. Madhavi from Environmental Studies, who discussed the establishment of the Green Revolution, including its advantages and disadvantages, as well as the effects of plastic degradation.

This was followed by Dr. P. Kiran Kumari from Zoology, who compared chemical fertilisers to biofertilizers. Next, Dr. B. Sailaja, also from Zoology, provided detailed information on vermicompost production and highlighted an in-house project related to it. Dr. S. Subha from Microbiology then presented on microbes as biofertilizers, showcasing the use of Azolla in farming conducted by a student under her supervision.

The session continued with Dr. M. Bharati from Biotechnology, who discussed the commercial production of biofertilizers and addressed an in-house project as well. Following her, Dr. D. Manyasree, also from Biotechnology, presented on nano-biofertilizers.

Dr. K. Geetha from Botany then spoke about microgreens, and the final presentation was delivered by Smt. B. Swapna from Botany, who discussed sleep physiology. Feedback on all the presentations was provided by Dr. P. Surekha, Vice Principal for UG. The session concluded with her presentation on "Ikigai," the Japanese secret to a long and happy life.
